

KISSINGER MEETS WITH YAHYA AGAIN

KARACHI, Pakistan, July 11 —Henry A. Kissinger, President Nixon's adviser on national security affairs, had a second meeting today with the President of Pakistan, Agha Mohammad Yahya Khan, before leaving for Tehran, Iran. They met first on Thursday after Mr. Kissinger's arrival from New Delhi.

They had lunch today in Rawalpindi after Mr. Kissinger returned here from Nathiagali, a 9,000-foot-high hill resort some 60 miles from Rawalpinda. He left for Nathiagali on Friday morning because of what was described as an "indisposition" and was to return to Rawalpinda yesterday, but extended his stay at the resort by a day.

A Pakistani Foreign Office spokesman said that international issues, bilateral relations and economic assistance were reviewed at the talks, which were attended by senior Pakis-

tani officials. He added that Mr. Kissinger delivered a personal message from President Nixon to the Pakistani President, but he did not disclose its contents. Mr. Kissinger also delivered a message to the Prime Minister of India, Mrs. Indira Gandhi.

Indo-Pakistani issues were discussed and according to the spokesman, Mr. Kissinger gave the impressions he had received in his talks with Indian leaders. But the spokesman denied that Mr. Kissinger was mediating between the two countries.

ISLAMABAD Pakistan, July 11 (Reuters)—Pakistan Government spokesman denied today news reports that Mr. Kissinger conferred with Kamal Hossein, an East Pakistani political leader, on his trip to Nathiagali.
