

**AGNEW, IN NAIROBI,
SEES KENYAN LEADER**JUL 14 1971

NAIROBI, Kenya, July 13— Vice President Agnew met informally here today with Kenya's President, Jomo Kenyatta.

With no serious issues between the two countries, no substantive discussions were planned, informants here said. The principal purpose of the session, they added, was to exchange assurances of continued good relations between the two countries.

Mr. Agnew planned to spend part of the night observing local game from a lounge at Treetops, a hotel built among trees and on wooden pilings about two hours drive from here. He is to return to Nairobi tomorrow. He leaves for Kinshasa, the Congo, Thursday on the next leg of his 10-nation goodwill tour, which began June 27.

At luncheon today Mr. Agnew gave Mr. Kenyatta a replica of a lamp used by George Washington—the original is in the Smithsonian Institution in Washington—and in return received an ankle-length fur cape typical of those worn by elders of the Kikuyu tribe, a foot-long carved wooden rhinoceros and a carved wooden elephant.
