Nixon Welcomes Agnew Home From 10-Nation Tour

WASHINGTON, July 28 (Reuters)—Vice President Agnew returned today from a 31-day world tour and was greeted with a "welcome back" from President Nixon on the White House lawn.

Mr. Agnew arrived home from his 10-nation tour to be greeted at Andrews Air Force Base by Secretary of State William P. Rogers and other Cabinet members. Following the Presidential greeting, Mr. Agnew and Mr. Rogers were ushered into the President's White House office, where the

Vice President began a report on his trip.
Mr. Nixon's national security affairs adviser, Henry A. Kissinger, also greeted the Vice President.
The President set aside

about an hour to hear a report on the trip, which took Mr. Agnew to South Korea, Singapore, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Ethiopia, Kenya, the Congo, Spain, Morocco and Portugal.
