John Eisenhower Quits as Envoy

Coming as a distinct surprise in Washington was the resignation of John S. D. Eisenhower as Ambassador to Belgium.

President Nixon's press secretary, Ronald L. Ziegler, said Mr. Eisenhower was leaving his post in Brussels, which he assumed in 1969, for "personal reasons."

Mr. Eisenhower, the son of President Dwight D. Eisenhower, is close personally and officially to Mr. Nixon. His son, David, is married to the former Julie Nixon.

Mr. Ziegler quoted Mr. Nixon as having praised Mr. Eisenhower's performance in Brussels, saying he had served "with exceptional competence and in doing so had contributed significantly in strengthening longtime ties of friendship between our country and Belgium."

An exchange of letters between Mr. Eisenhower and Mr. Nixon was not made public by the White House.
