

**AGNEW FINDS HARM  
FROM LIBERAL VIEW**

ATLANTA, Sept. 30 (UPI)— Vice President Agnew charged today that a combination of ultraliberal distaste for "the sweet smell of success" and the aggressiveness of international competitors was rapidly eroding the nation's economic and military strength.

Mr. Agnew, addressing the 18th annual convention of the Society of Former F.B.I. Agents, renewed his attacks on "avant garde opinion," some news media, the Senate and Senator Hubert H. Humphrey, Democrat of Minnesota.

He said that the "steady

diminution" of American military strength was not due just to "de-emphasis of preparedness" but also a "dramatic increase in military strength that is being achieved by our principal competitors in the world."

Mr. Agnew said that the free enterprise system that had built America's strength and other long-standing American principles were "under attack today as never before, principally from the liberal and radical left.

He criticized Mr. Humphrey for his statement that a "just for superiority" had added to an arms race when Mr. Humphrey had tried to get the Senate to suspend the multihead ballistic missile program (MIRV).
