GOP Rightists Blast Nixon

The ultra-conservative United Republicans of California yesterday voted to organize a "dump Nixon" slate for the GOP primary in 1972 and passed two angry anti-United Nations resolutions.

Denouncing President Nixon as a "walking catastrophe" and his administration as a "left-wing betrayal," UROC state chairman Walter H. Hintzen said his group would work to place an "uncommitted" convention delegate on the primary ballot.

Angered over the expulsion of the Nationalist Chinese regime and the entry of mainland China to the U.N., the right-wing group demanded that the United States withdraw from the world body.

UROC also asked that U.N. headquarters be removed from American soil. "The
