G.I. in Unit Guarding Nixon Seized in Bomb Trafficking

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 24 (Reuters)—A soldier whose unit helps guard President Nixon at the Western White House was arrested today on charges of conspiracy and alleged trafficking in plastic bombs as he boarded a plane at the Los Angeles International Airport.

Officials said they did not think the bombs were part of a plot against the President. The Redondo Beach police, who began the bomb trafficking investigation three months ago, said a pass into the Western White House was found on Michael A. Ohlmann, 19 years old, an enlisted man in the ordnance depot at Fort MacArthur, south of here.

Also arrested were Ricky James Murray, 25; Kathleen Marie Murray, 19, his wife, and William Boyd, 27.
