G.O.P. Conservatives Urged By Goldwater to Back Nixon

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Dec. 9
(AP) — Senator Barry Goldwater says conservative critics of President Nixon are a threat "to the entire party, the entire country, the entire free world and freedom itself."

The Arizona Republican, himself a conservative, urged party faithful to unite and stand "shoulder to shoulder with Richard Nixon."

Mr. Goldwater made his attack on the President's condidate in 1964, said.

Servative critics in an address last night to 250 persons attending a \$125-a-plate fund raising dinner for Senator John G. Tower, Republican of Texas. Senator Goldwater, delayed in Washington by Senate business, spoke over a telephone hookup.

He said he had heard talk that if the conservatives find no candidate to run against Mr. Nixon in the 1972 election "This is nothing but default," Mr. Goldwater, who was the Republican Presidential cantack on the President's condidate in 1964, said.
