Kennedy Says President Has Failed To Carry Out 'Promise' of America

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17 Senator Edward M. Kennedy, sounding very much like the Presidential candidate that he insists he is not, accused the Nixon Administration tonight of failing to carry out "the bright promise of the American na-tion."

In a speech reminiscent of those delivered more than a decade ago by his brother, President Kennedy, the Massa-chusetts Democrat told the Washington Press Cluby Washington Press Club:



Senator Kennedy called for new leadership in the White House, but he did not endorse any of the Democratic candi-dates now seeking the Presi-

dency. Instead, he detailed what he viewed as the failings of the Nixon Administration in foreign and domestic policies. These policies, he said, have contributed to a crisis of the national spirit.
