Kissinger, President Nixon's adviser on national security, wowed 1,000 guests at the Washington Press Club's "Night in Peking" dinner. Giving a mock report on preparations for Mr. Nixon's summit meeting in Chinanext month, Mr. Kissinger said that one of the problems he had to deal with was "getting Bebe Rebozo's houseboat up the Yangtzee River." After much diplomatic maneuvering, he said, a compromise had been reached on the menu for the official dinner in Peking—"cottage cheese with soy sauce." Addressing nimself to Gloria Steinem's frequent disclaimer that she was not one of his past, present or future girl friends, Mr. Kissinger said: "... But I am not discouraged.
