The port city of Haiphong and the suburbs of Hanoi were bombed and strafed. There are victims among the civil-ian population and serious material dámage has been inflicted. The Soviet people wrath-

The continuing build-up of American air and naval forces in the Indochina region, the renewal of raids over the territory of the Democratic Republic of Viet-nam, and Washington's de-cision to interrupt the Paris talks indefinitely—all these are in irreconcilable contra-diction with official declara-tions that the United States tions that the United States is seeking to achieve a peace-ful settlement in the region.
