Former G.O.P. Leader Declines to Back Nixon

Declines to Back Nixon SAN DIEGO, April 27 (AP) -Dr. Gaylord B. Parkinson, who served as national cam-paign chairman for Richard M. Nixon in 1967, said yester-day he could not in good conscience support the Presi-dent for re-election. "I have so many differ-ences with the Nixon Admin-istration that I just can't support the President's re-election," Dr. Parkinson said in an interview with The San Diego Evening Tribune. "It's a matter of conscience." Dr. Parkinson, who was California Republican chair-man in 1965 and 1966, said that he intended to resign as an honorary delegate on the state's convention slate pledged to Mr. Nixon. Dr. Parkinson, of Gross-mont, said that he was con-cerned over the lowering of defense spending under Mr. Nixon and what he called the Administration's failure to cut back the "Great Society" programs of former President Lyndon B. Johnson.
