The UROC endorsement followed Saturday's election of Paul Magnani of Oak View, as its new state chairman. Magnani is an Ashbrook supporter.
He defeated John Ryan of Torrance, who took no position on the Ashbrook-Nixon issue, by a vote of 438-178.

Accusations
In his speech, Ashbrook accused Nixon of "negotiating from a position of weakness" in the Vietnam war, and leading the nation to "the verge of bankruptcy" through economic policies.
'I have listened to my
friend (Vice President) Spiro Agnew . . . pointing out to the American people the danger that comes from 'effete, intellectual, sophisticated snobs'..
"This administration has its share of effete, arrogant, intellectual snobs . . .and if you're wondering who I am talking about, I am talking about people like Henry Kissinger.'
The remark and reference to the President's chief foreign policy advisor earned Ashbrook the heaviest standing ovation of the evening.
