Secret Nixon War Papers Put Into Record

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The secret Nixon Administration Vietnam policy papers that Sen. Mike Gavel has been blocked for more than two weeks from making public were quietly inserted in the Congressional Record today by Ronald V. Dellums (D-Berkeley).

Dellums said Gravel gave him the papers.

He inserted in the record without objections from any House member 29 pages of the memorandum sometimes referred to as the Kissinger papers, on opposing Pentagon and civilian agencies' recommendations on Vietnam war policy in 1969.
