

Security Tight in Tokyo For Kissinger's Arrival

TOKYO, June 9 (UPI) — Henry A. Kissinger, President Nixon's adviser on national security, arrived in Japan today on an unofficial visit that will include talks with Prime Minister Eisaku Sato and other Japanese leaders.

Riot police and armored cars were stationed at the entrance to the airport and spectators were barred from the terminal.

About 200 students of both the right and the left staged separate demonstrations but the police kept them away from the airport.

The leftists opposed Mr. Kissinger's visit because, they said, he was "the mastermind of American war efforts in Vietnam."

The rightists were against him because he had arranged Mr. Nixon's visits to Peking and Moscow.
