The White House announced yesterday that President Nixon has named Ralph E. Erickson to be-come deputy attorney general to succeed Richard Klein-

dienst, who was sworn in June 12 as attorney general. Erickson, 43, a member of the Justice Department since October 1971, has been since January 11 assistant attorney general in charge of the Office of Legal Coun-sel, a post often described as the lawyer for the Presi-, dent's chief lawyer.

Prior to joining the admin-istration in 1971 in the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Erickson was associated with the Los Angeles law firm of Musich, Peeler and Garrett.
