KISSINGER, IN CHINA, HAS LATE-HOUR TALK

HAS LATE-HOUR TALK The Globe and Mail, Toronto PEKING, Friday, June 23— Henry A. Kissinger, President Nixon's adviser for national security, traveled to a corner of the Forbidden City last night for an extended meeting with Chinese leaders, possibly his last before leaving for Washington some time today. The meeting began after din-ner and lasted until past mid-night, raising to more than 12 hours the amount of time spent in talks since Mr. Kissinger arrived here Monday. Correspondents were alerted to the late-night session by the line of security men and sol-diers strung out along a three-mile route from the rear of the Forbidden City, where Govern-ment offices are, to the state guest house where Mr. Kis-singer and his party are staying. It was considered highly improbable that Mr. Kissinger was meeting with chairman Mao Tse-tung, who has not re-ceived any foreign visitors since his meeting with Presi-dent Nixon in February. It was thought likely that Mr. Kis-singer was meeting with Premier Chou En-lai.
