KISSINGER RETURNS

WASHINGTON, June 23—Henry A. Kissinger, the White House adviser on national security affairs, returned to Washington this afternoon after four days of talks in Peking with Premier Chou En-lai and other Chinese officials.

Upon his arrival at Andrews Air Force Base in nearby Maryland, Mr. Kissinger went directly to the White House to report to President Nixon on his trip, which has been shrouded in secrecy.

Before he left for China last week, the White House said only that Mr. Kissinger would discuss a broad range of questions with the Chinese. There has been considerable speculation that Vietnam was one of the questions.
