

Kissinger Back From China

Washington

Henry A. Kissinger returned from his fourth trip to China yesterday and immediately joined President Nixon for a weekend report on the visit.

After going by helicopter from the airport to the White House, Kissinger joined the President for another brief flight to the presidential retreat at Camp David, Md., where the discussions will continue.

Kissinger, who talked with Premier Chou En-lai and other Chinese leaders, met

for an hour and 15 minutes with Mr. Nixon and Secretary of State William P. Rogers at the White House.

Rogers will leave today for SEATO and ANZUS meetings in Australia, followed by visits to three Eastern European countries, Greece and two Persian

Gulf nations.

Departing yesterday, for China were Representatives Gerald Ford (Rep. - Mich.) and Hale Boggs (Dem-La.), party leaders in the House. They were given a sendoff at a breakfast hosted by Mr. Nixon.
