Richard Kleindienst held a press conference today in San Francisco at the convention of the American Bar Association, not because he had anything to say, he told the press, but to give the press a chance to meet with him.

[Kleindicust refused to comment on Ransey Clart, "deferring" to Secretary of State Rogers, but did make some earment about Janu Ponda.]

Mr. Eleindienst also had these comments about the Justice Department's response to the busgin - the attemptod bugging - at the Democratic National Headquarters in Washington:

Eleindienst [voice]: "I'o like to rescribe for you the kind of action that if you'd been the c in Washin ton you ould have already seen - and that's, No. 1, the
most comprehensive, complete, thorough investigation by the PDI of any matter, I think,
on a scale equal almost, I think, to the assau inetion of President Hennedy. And in
addition to that, one of the lost vigorous, cooperative efforts by the United States
Attorney's office in Washington, D.C., and proceedings before a grand jury.

"Other than that, because it's a matter under investigation I - as I do in all matters being investigated - I do not care to make any comment. But I am satisfied that when the process has completed itself that this administration and the Department of Justice of this administration will not be answerable to the criticism that it either attempted to whitewash it, that it ignored it, and indeed I think there will be a designing silence by some of our political opponents which will mean that in fact we did investigate and pursue this matter with complete, comprehensive thoroughness."
