Kissinger,**Russ Talks****Still Secret**

MOSCOW — (AP) — Henry Kissinger continued his talks with Kremlin leaders today for the second day, but U.S. and Soviet officials maintained a tight news blackout.

U.S. sources let slip one item of information, that President Nixon's national security adviser was lunching today with Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko and U. S. Ambassador Jacob Beam.

A U.S. Embassy spokesman said he could not disclose which Soviet officials Kissinger was meeting, where they were meeting or what they were talking about.

Kissinger arrived in Moscow Sunday night to continue the talks begun during President Nixon's visit in May. He was to discuss such matters as Vietnam, the Middle East, nuclear arms negotiations, trade and European security with Communist Party chief Leonid Brezhnev, Premier Alexei Kosygin and Gromyko.

One source said there was a possibility Kissinger might finish his talks today instead of tomorrow, as originally planned.
