Charges Are Blunt

Some of the charges in the new spots are blunt, but the presentation is far from visually sensational. The television spots consist of nothing but a "crawl"—white type moving slowly up a black screen as a voice reads the same message. At the end, the standard closing frame of the McGovern spots appears briefly: A profile of the Senator, his last name in large type and a small line acknowledging that this has been a paid political announcement. The usual spoken tagline, "MeGovern . . . Democrat . . . for the country," has been dropped. The new radio commercials consist of the soundtrack of the television suggests that John B.
