

M'GREGOR, LANIGAN GET COMPANY POSTS

Two leading Republican party officials, Clark MacGregor and Charles T. Lanigan, were appointed to corporate jobs yesterday, the day after President Nixon's sweeping re-election victory.

Their new posts will involve the companies' relations with government.

Mr. MacGregor, 50 years old, resigned yesterday as director of the Committee for the Re-election of the President to become a vice president of United Aircraft Corporation. In making the announcement, United said, "We have felt that we needed expertise to help us participate in establishing effective communications between the business world and the public sector."

Mr. Lanigan, 47, the New York State Republican Chairman, was named vice president for government relations at the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, effective Jan. 1. The announcement from the nation's second-largest insurer included a statement that "Mr. Lanigan's responsibilities will include service as a spokesman for Metropolitan before governmental agencies, "but a company spokesman later asked that the section of the news release in which these words were included be deleted.
