Notes on People James F. Clàrity Harvard Still Awaits Kissinger

Harvard is waiting for word from Henry A. Kissinger on his plans so it can decide whether to fill his vacant professor of-government post. Mr. Kissinger left Harvard in 1968 to become President Nixon's national security adviser, and the school's government department has kept the slot temporarily open. But with the announcement that Mr. Kissinger would stay with the President, the prospect arose that somebody else would be taking his professorship.

Wilson, chairman of the government department. "But I don't know how long Dr. Kissinger intends to stay on now in Washington. The department won't wait if he's going to be gone a long period of time. We now expect to have a firm statement from Dr. Kissinger in the immediate future, but there's no fixed date that we expect it," he said.
