Swiss' Cuban Envoy To Confer on Hijacking

The State Department said yesterday the Swiss ambassador to Cuba is flying to Washington to consult with American officials today on the progress so far in the negotiations with Cuba on an anti-hijacking agreement.

Department spokesman Charles W. Bray said Ambassador Silvio Masnata, who represents American interests in Cuba, was invited

to Washington to discuss his impression of the Cuban attitude toward the talks, and to receive the American views.

The State Department also said that a new airlift of Cubans emigrating to the U.S. would begin Monday on a one-a-day basis and would consist of 40 flights. About 3400 Cubans will be permitted to leave.
