Kissinger Will Stick With Nixon

Henry A. Kissinger said yesterday he is staying at the White House as President Nixon's chief foreign policy adviser.

When told by a reporter that Harvard University has set a deadline of February 5 for him to return to his teaching post or to sever his academic ties, Kissinger said, "What makes you think I would want to go back?"

He said he has no intention of leaving the White House and said of authorities at Harvard: "It takes six months to get them to agree on anything."

Whereupon a reporter asked, "Why did it take four years to negotiate an end to the Vietnam war?"

Kissinger made no reply.
