—The president of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, Frank E. Fitzsimmons, and other union officials gave President Nixon's campaign a total of \$9,500 just before the November election, newly filed Federal reports show.

A teamsters fund-raising committee in New Jersey donated another \$5,000 to the Nixon campaign. Nationwide, the union supported the Presi-

the union supported the President's re-election.

The contributions were reported in a statement on contributions and expenditures submitted by Democrats for Nivon mitted by <u>Democrats for Nixon</u> to the General Accounting Of-

fice.

The report was one of the first of a flood of statements that are due by tomorrow, when political committees that raised \$1,000 or more during 1972 must make final reports on Presidential election financing and expenditures.

The reports available this week cover the last seven days before the Nov. 7 election and any spending and contributions since then

any spending and contributions since then.

Mr. Fitzsimmons was listed as having given \$4,000. Salvatore Provenzano, a New Jersey teamster official, gave \$2,000, according to the report.

Six other union officials accounted for the balance of the \$14,500 in contributions. The reports showed that persons indicated as officials of trucking companies had also made contributions to Mr. Nixon's campaign.

Large contributors to Mr. Nixon, as listed in the latest reports, included William P. Clements Jr., who gave \$5,773 on Nov. 3. The Senate confirmed Mr. Clements last week as Deputy Secretary of Defense.
