What does Henry A. Kissinger do to relax when he is in Washington? Well, David Bryan, a zookeeper at the National Zoological Park, said

that Mr. Kissinger is a frequent visitor to the two pandas (Hsing-Hsing and Ling-Ling) that were donated by China after President Nixon's visit to Peking. Mr. Bryan said Dr. Kissinger, the President's top foreign-policy adviser, has been to see the pandas four or five times in the last year and that he is allowed to stand closer to the animals than the general public. "He seems very interested in them," said Mr. Bryan. "He stays an hour or an hour and a half."
