It's the amnesty fight that begins—and John David Herndon is one of its casual-ties. A Vietnam veteran who went AWOL in 1970, Herndon returned two years later and offered himself as a test case. The charge: desertion. The defense: it is not a crime to desert an army engaged in war crimes. The outcome? The army never al-lowed the case to reach the courts; Herndon was given a dishonorable discharge.


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
