WASHINGTON, Feb. 20 (UPI) Henry A. Kissinger returned to the United States today and went directly to the White House to report to President Nixon on his two-week trip to North Vietnam, China and

Nixon on his two-week trip to North Vietnam, China and Japan.

President Nixon arrived from his Florida home only 20 minutes before Mr. Kissinger, his national security adviser. Although both their planes landed at Andrews Air Force Base in suburban Maryland, the President did not wait to greet Mr. Kissinger at the airport.

Mr. Nixon, who was smiling and in obvious good spirits, went directly to the White House by helicopter. Mr. Kissinger went by limousine.

Mr. Kissinger was sent by the President to confer with North Vietnamese leaders on possible postwar American aid and to confer with Chinese leaders on the future of United States-Chinese relations.

His stopover in Tokyo was aimed at improving United States-Japanese relations and
