WASHINGTON, June 8. -While still seeking a declaration of principles from European leaders when President Nixon goes to Europe this fall, the Administration

this fall, the Administration is no longer calling the contemplated document "a new Atlantic charter."

A senior State Department official said that Henry A. Kissinger, Mr. Nixon's national-security adviser, who coined the term, has quietly instructed other officials to stop using "new Atlantic charter" in discussions with Europeans.

The official said that most European leaders seemed to distrust the expression and have been arguing against the use of the term more than they have against the idea of Mr. Nixon and European leaders signing some kind of document outlining the "basic principles" of the future alliance.
