Add to the numerous recent changes at the White House a change in décor. Beneath the north portico, near the carpentry shop and maintenance areas, there is now a single-lane bowling alley, installed without publicity several months ago. Aides say the Nixon family paid for the lane out of their own funds. The installation will save the family a trip to the lanes installed during the Truman era at the Executive Office Building and gives the White House its first sports facility since the Nixons converted its swimming pool into a press area.

Marriage revealed: Ann Kissinger, former wife of Henry A. Kissinger, assistant to the President for national security affairs, to Saul G. Cohen, professor of chemistry at Brandeis University, on June 1 in Waltham, Mass. Present at the ceremony were the bride's two children of her previous marriage, which ended in divorce in 1964 after 15 years. The bridegroom, a widower, has two children by his first marriage, a son, 28, and a daughter, 23.
