In Seattle, television stations reported 16 calls from irate citi-zens who wanted Mr. Brezh-nev's 47-minute speech taken off the air because he was a Communist. Viewers in Salt Lake City complained that it was "too long" or that they were "tired of being sold out to Russia, even on television."
