## 1973 JUL 5 The Gallup Poll Nixon's Popularit **Stays in Doldrun**

PRINCETON, N.J.-Two separate measurements in the latest nationwide Gallup survey give further evidence of Watergate's sharp impact on President Nixon's stand-

ing with American voters: In a rerun of the 1972 presidential contest, Presi-dent Nixon wins over Sen. George McGovern by a far smaller margin than in last fall's election.

Mr. Nixon's current popularity rating remains near hs all-time low figure of 44 per cent approval. However, it should be noted that the President's popularity rating has apparently bottomed out and remained virtually unchanged over a period of nearly two months.

The possibility exists that Ir. Nixon's popularity Mr. would have been lower than would have been lower than the figure reported today had it not been for the re-cent visit by Communist party leader Lenoid Brezh-nev. Previous surveys have shown that, typically, a President's popularity is boosted by summit meetings President's popularity is boosted by summit meetings with Russian leaders.

In the latest survey, conducted after John Dean III's charges were made public but prior to his testimony before the Senate investigat-ing committee, 45 per cent of all persons interviewed said they approved of the said they approved of the way Mr. Nixon is handling his job as President, while an equal number, 45 per cent, disapproved. Ten per cent expressed no opinion.

Here is the question asked which matches President Nixon against McGovern:

"If the presidential elec-tion were being held TO-DAY, which candidate DAY, which candidate would you vote for-Nixon, the Republican, or McGov-ern, the Democrat?"
