Nixon Not Aware Of Faked Records

Henry Kissinger declared yesterday that the White House "neither ordered nor was it aware of any falsification of records" on the secret bombing of Cambodia in 1969 and 1970.

The President's adviser on national security, in a brief telephone interview, also announced that the White House had begun an inves-

tigation into the falsification.

Asked his opinion about the official mishandling of records, Kissinger said, "I think it's deplorable."

The Defense Department conceded this week that B-52s were bombing Cambodia for 14 months before May, 1970, although the U.S. was officially professing a policy of respecting that nation's neutrality.
