The ousted head of the Small Business Administration's Richmond office approved at least \$2.8 million in funds during the past year to firms with which his present brotherin-law was associated, it was learned yesterday.

According to SBA officials and records examined by the Associated Press, the loans were approved during a period from December, 1972. to September of this year.

The largest of the amounts approved by Thomas F. Re-gan, who was removed Monday as chief of the Richmond SBA office. was for \$2.3 million in lease guarantees for construction of a steel pant in Portsmouth, Va., according to Russel Hamilton, former chief of the Philadelphia regional SBA office.

Hamilton, whose office su-pervised the Richmond operation, said the loan to Dunn International Corp., was approved by Regan on September 1 but never was approved by the Philadelphia or Washington offices.

Eleven days earlier - on September 1 - Regan, 44, had been married in Charlottesville to Terri Marie that the firm was notified Kirkham Palumbo, 38, sister of Dunn executive vice pres-

ident Joseph C. Palumbo.

Records of loans approved for guarantee by the Richmond SBA office showed that a loan of \$350,000 was approved in July this year for Trans Ocean Steel Corp., of which Palumbo is listed as a director.

The records also show approval in December 1972 of a \$200,000 loan to Remote Console Information Corp. of McLean, Va., of which Palumbo is a director.

An official of Dunn International Corp. said the \$2.3 million lease guarantee money had not been used, and yesterday by the SBA that the arrangement had been
