

U.S. Funds Beef Up San Clemente Police

SAN CLEMENTE, Calif., Nov. 20 (AP)—The Law Enforcement Assistance Administration has awarded this city \$189,207—an increase of \$52,000 from last year—to help provide police services required by the presence of the Western White House.

Rolland Maxson, the city's

grant program coordinator, said the extra money was needed to pay personnel and overhead costs that the city had absorbed in the past.

The LEAA has awarded San Clemente a total of \$584,835 for its police force. Maxson said some of the money is used for some members of the 49-member police force. The funds also help pay for training, including methods for handling large crowds, demonstrations and riots, he added.
