Senate OKs New Chairman Of Joint Chiefs

Washington

The Senate yesterday confirmed Air Force General George S. Brown as the new chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Brown will serve a two-year term starting July 1 as successor to retiring Admiral Thomas S. Moorer.

Also confirmed was the appointment of General David C. Jones to a four-year-term as Air Force chief of staff, along with these other nominations:

Terrell H. Bell, Utah, New U.S. commissioner of education.

Jack Franklin Bennett, Connecticut, and Edward C. Schmults, Maryland, to be undersecretaries of the treasury.
