Peter M. Flanigan, a White House aide since President Nixon took office in 1969, announced his resignation yesterday as assistant to the President.

In 1971 he became the President's chief assistant for international economic affairs, conducting foreign trade negotiations and supervising the work of Ambassador William Eberle in tariff negotiations.

Flanigan was a New York investment executive before joining the White Houst staff.
