Mr. Nixon took advantage of warm, sunny weather to walk on the beach with three friends who came with him Friday to an isolated beach house on this narrow, sandy island. John N. Mitchell, the former Attorney General, C. G. Rebozo, a Florida banker, and Robert Abplan-alp, a New York industrial-ist accompanied Mr. Nixon on the walk from the beach house owned by Thomas Mc-Cabe, a paper company exec-utive, to the edge of the Assateague Island national seashore—a two-mile round trip.
