For Nixon?

ASSATEAGUE ISLAND (Md.) — (UPI) — With retreats at Camp David, Key Biscayne and San Clemente already at his disposal, President Nixon appears interested in one more refuge from Washington.

It's a 30-room summer home nestled among the 10-foot sand dunes of Assateague Island, the wind-swept Atlantic Ocean beach he visited one week ago.

The President and three companions stayed at Camp Genezar, a \$1.6 million dollar property formerly owned by Philadelphia industrialist Thomas McCabe, a Nixon supporter and former chairman of the board of the Scott Paper Co.

Assateague Island National Seashore now owns the property and allows McCabe to use it.

Usually informative local residents are strangely mum on the subject of the house and future plans for it.
