Nixon to Delay Site Of Library

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — President Nixon is not expected to announce the site of his presidential library until after the election — so as not to alienate the losers. He is believed to be leaning strongly toward locating the memorial on a scenic hillside above San Mateo canyon near his San Clemente villa.

Nixon made two secret trips to look over the area last spring. The hillside affords a panoramic view of the inland wilderness areas, the coastline and his Spanish style estate to the west.

The Richard M. Nixon Foundation has been studying various locations and the President's brother Edward, a member, has visited the other presidential libraries researching the project.

There is a possibility that Whittier College, a strong competitor for the library, may be involved in housing some study facilities connected with it. The President's brother is in favor of establishing a museum for tourists and a library for scholars.

The library, which is expected to draw a million visitors a year, will include presidential and family mementos as well as private papers of the Nixon years.
