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President Nixon has sold two plots of waterfront land on Key Biscayne, the Florida resort he frequently visits, to a Yonkers lawyer for \$150,000. William E. Griffin, whose office is at 30 South Broadway in Yonkers, confirmed in a telephone interview Thursday night that he had made the purchase. He said he had bought the land for investment and possibly to build a home there for his family. The lots are on canal-front land near the entrance to Cape Florida State Park. One was bought by Mr. Nixon in 1967 at a cost of \$30,000, according to Dade County Court tax rec-ords, and the other was ac-quired by the President in 1971 for \$23,100. The property is less than a mile from the closely guarded compound where the President stays during his Florida trips. The price of the sale to Mr. Griffin, which took place yes-terday, was calculated by The Miami Herald from an examina-tion of tax stamps on the deed of sale. This would indicate that Mr. Nixon and his wife, Pat, who sold the lots jointly, real-ized a gain of \$96,900 over the price at which they bought the lots.

Thomas H. Wakefield, a lawyer who has represented Mr. Nixon in previous land dealings on the booming tropical island, said the sale price was \$150,000.

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
