## WHITE HOUSE DENIES. NIXON FUND ARTICLE

WASHINGTON, May 14 (AP)
—The White House described as "a total fabrication" yesterday a newspaper article that said Senate investigators believed President Nixon might have used leftover 1968 campaign funds to buy his California estate.

"It is a totally false and malicious report," Ronald L. Ziegler, press secretary, said.

The Santa Ana Register quoted unidentified investigators for the Senate Watergate committee as saying they believed Mr. Nixon may have used \$1-million in unreported funds left over from his 1968 Presidential campaign to purchase the estate at San Clemente.
