

White House Will Disclose Nixon Land Data on Friday

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP) —The White House said today it would disclose on Friday details of President Nixon's land transactions in California and Florida.

The statement was first promised a week ago when a Presidential spokesman vigorously denied a report by The Santa Ana Register that Senate investigators were looking into the possibility that campaign funds may have been used to finance Mr. Nixon's estate at San Clemente.

Gerald L. Warren, deputy press secretary, said that the White House had decided to set a "date certain" for release of the information rather than face daily questions on when the data would be available.

He said the release had been delayed because the White House wanted to make certain the information was "complete, accurate and documented."
