No major ground actions in-volving Americans were re-ported anywhere in South Viet-nam in the last 24 hours.

Laos Incursion Reported

KHAMDUC, South Vietnam, Aug. 21 (AP)—Some crewmen of United States helicopters that have ferried South Viet-namese troops into this high and densely jungled region at the Laotian frontier say that a South Vietnamese force as large as a battalion—about 400 men

- crossed the border into Laos. The said their helicopters recently carried the troops into landing zones just short of the frontier, and that the South Vietnamese walked across. The soldiers returned a few days later, after looking for enemy supply caches, the pilots said. The helicopter landings were so close to the border, they said, that some aircraft could not help being carried across the frontier by their flight pat-terns as they arched up and away from the dropoff zones.
