

Jury Won't Make Public San Jose Probe

The Santa Clara County Grand Jury will not make a public report on its investigation into the October 29 demonstration against President Nixon's motorcade, the jury foreman said yesterday.

"Everything has been covered before," Ernest Renzel said. "We just went over it

all again, so to speak."

Four men charged with misdemeanors arising from the incident are awaiting trial.

"We are satisfied that we have acquired by investigation those facts that represent what happened at the San Jose Civic Auditorium the night of President Nix-

on's visit," Renzel said.

"We are further satisfied that those identifiable persons who committed crimes have been charged for their actions.

"This completes our Grand Jury investigation."

A flurry of rock-throwing occurred as Mr. Nixon left the rally where he cam-

paigned for the re-election of Governor Ronald Reagan and Senator George Murphy.

Santa Clara District Attorney Louis Bergna said his office had reported the findings of its investigation to the Grand Jury as requested. Bergna said he would have no comment on matters considered by the jury.
