### **Antiquarians Say No To Nixon as Member**

WORCESTER, Mass., April 24 (UPI)—President Nixon has been rejected for membership in the American Antiquarian Society.

The blackballing was announced Thursday, but the group gave no reason.

The President did not seek membership in the organization, which has one of the largest libraries in the world on American cultural history. It was reported that Mr. Nixon did not know his name had been submitted.

Mr. Nixon is the first President nominated who was refused membership. Thirteen Presidents have been members. The most recent was Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The President's name was on a list of 10 nominees submitted to the society's annual meeting. The nine others
