Tricia Nixon's Bridal Party for June 12

WASHINGTON, May 6—The White House announced today the members of Tricia Nixon's bridal party for her wedding to Edward Cox Finch in the White House Rose Garden June 12. There will be only four attendants, all relatives of the couple.

Miss Nixon's younger sister, Mrs. David Eisenhower, 22 years old, will be matron of honor. Miss Mary Ann (Mazie) Cox, 25, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Ellis Cox of New York and Westhampton Beach, L. I. and sister of the prospective bridegroom, will be bridesmaid.

The two junior bridesmaids will be Amelie (Amy) Nixon, who will be 13 June 4, and Elizabeth (Beth) Nixon, 11, of Seattle. Both are the daughters of Edward C. Nixon, 41, a mutual fund executive who is the youngest of the President's four brothers. Tricia Nixon turned 25 in February; her fiancé is 24.

Julie Nixon Eisenhower was graduated from the

Chapin School in New York in 1966 and from Smith College in Northampton, Mass., last year. The bride is also a Chapin graduate. Mrs. Eisenhower is now a graduate student at Catholic University. Her husband is an ensign in the Naval Reserve at Virginia Beach, Va.

Miss Cox was a Chapin graduate and president of her class in 1963. She was graduated from Smith College in 1967, and is to be graduated this month from the Yale University School of Architecture. Her brother studied architecture for a year at Yale and then switched to

Harvard Law School. He will be graduated in 1972.

Weather permitting, Miss Nixon's wedding party will come down the curving staircase leading from the White House south facade to the Rose Garden. In case of rain, the ceremony will take place in the East Room.

The officiating minister will be Dr. Edward Latch, chaplain of the United States House of Representatives and pastor of the Spring Valley Methodist Church in Washington. Julie and Tricia's childhood home was in Spring Valley during the years their father was Vice President.
