A Chinese Recipe for the Nixons

Henry A. Kissinger, the President's national security adviser, may not think of everything his employer needs, but he seems to try hard. Mrs. Richard M. Nixon disclosed that Mr. Kissinger, returning from a trip to China, where he made preparations for the President's visit, brought here a recipe for chicken and walnuts. Mrs. Nixon, who said the dish would be prepared for the President next week, said she didn't know whether she would go to China, but if she didn't, "I certainly will be disappointed."
